

RON LENT of Dushore, PA (formerly of Flemington NJ) has been a member since 1973 and was in the 50th Anniversary Show,. A past President of the Essex Watercolor Club he was instrumental in forming the Hunterdon Watercolor Society. His classical transparent watercolor style led to membership and 15 awards from the Garden State Watercolor Society and 16 awards from the NJWCS. Since moving to Pennsylvania he has gained membership in

the **Pennsylvania Watercolor Society** as well as several awards. Ron had a painting published in the <u>Best of Watercolor III.</u> Lent was recently accepted as a Signature Member into the **American Society of Marine Artists**, the most prestigious art organization that deals entirely with subjects maritime.

"Ron's distinctive traditional style reflects the artist's sensitive insight and refined craftsmanship. His fascination with light—direct sunlight or atmospherically modified light—is evident, while his commitment to natural color and a rich varied palette produces fresh, clean watercolors. 

ED BAUMLIN of Frenchtown, NJ, gained membership in 2009 and is a graduate of the *Art Career School* in New York City. A past President of the *Hunterdon Watercolor Society* he has also been *Vice President* of the *Garden State Watercolor Society* and *NJ Allied Artist Professional League*. He owned and operated a graphic freelance design studio for over two decades. Baumlin has been very active with the *Hunterdon Watercolor Society* and *Garden State Watercolor Society* winning numerous awards. Ed won *The Avery and Nina Johnson Memorial Award* from the *NJWCS* in 2021 for *Canyon Condors* and the *Garden State Watercolor Society Award* for "Sunrise in December" (right) from the *GSWS* in 2009.

"Ed became interested in watercolor about 18 years ago. Early in his studies, it soon became apparent that he had a natural talent for using this difficult medium, and it wasn't long before he

began to enter shows, display his work, and win awards. Ed has now started to experiment with two other mediums, acrylics and pastels, both exciting to work with, giving his pieces a completely new look.

Inspired by color, he uses glazes of light and dark hues, and utilizes shapes, that invoke interest, as he perceives them. His paintings are light and airy, yet they never seem to be repetitive. Ed captures the spontaneity of the moment in a realistic manner, resulting in an exceedingly pleasing effect."




TIM MULLEN of Hillsborough NJ became a member around 1983, was included in the 50th Anniversary Show and helped to design the current NJWCS logo. Tim is a graduate of the Columbus College of Art and Design (CCAD), but is self-taught in watercolor. Until the mid-1990s he regularly participated in shows with NJWCS, GSWS, and other organizations, winning numerous awards including the Grumbacher Gold Medal for "Tulips in Venice" in the 1992 Tri-State Show, and the Irving and Frances Phillips Award (3rd) for "Deja Vuarnet" in the 1989 NJWCS Open Show. Since then Mullen has concentrated on his commercial work starting as an Art Director

(1980-93) before founding **Mullen Design, LLC** in 1993, which does traditional advertising web design, corporate communications, etc. He also has a web page on **Fine Art America** to sell his fine art work.


rt Centers & Societies in New Jersey: There are many art groups around the state that have helped to develop new artists. They not only provide classes and a chance to get to know other artists, they provide the first place for artists to show, and gain confidence

The Hunterdon Watercolor Society (HWS, sites.google.com/site/hunterdonwatercolorsociety) is an organization of watercolor artists in the Hunterdon County area. Watercolor artists of all proficiency levels, from beginner through advanced, are welcome. Their meetings and demos are held at the Flemington Presbyterian Church, 10 East Main Street, Flemington, NJ. (first Wednesday, September through May). Currently they are holding their art shows on-line, but once covid doesn't interfere they will hold their exhibits at various local gallery spaces. Besides presenting numerous demos by NJWCS members, and its membership includes DORIS ETLINGER, JOAN CAPALDO, ED BAUMLIN and and (Past NJWCS President) HENRIETTA MANEVA.

The *HWS* started as a watercolor class offered in Flemington by **RON LENT**. To coax students to produce finished paintings he began the practice of offering small in-house art exhibits to encourage the students to strive for excellence. Ron got the *Hunterdon Library* to host the show of 'Ron Lents Students', but after a couple of years the library balked, feeling it could be seen as a commercial benefit. "The class enjoyed the experience of exhibiting their work so much in such a lovely and professional setting that some of the students in the class explored how they could continue the shows. After discussion led by Andrea Morrison, they applied for and received a *501(3)(c) tax exempt status* under the name *Hunterdon Watercolor Society*. At that point they were then able to exhibit at the library as a non-profit. Andrea was the person who did much of the work and the *HWS* initiated an award in her honor when she was diagnosed with *ALS*.



A (Quick) Prehistory of NJWCS part 1

watercolor early history, they speak about the cave paintings (mixed in the mouth and spit out), but imagine how the committee would react to that surface. We paint on paper, and stone walls don't qualify! The earliest forays into painting on paper go back to 4,000 BC China! But it wasn't until 400 AD that the Chinese founded their great tradition in landscape painting.

n the west, we did more wall painting (fresco) — still not so portable. There was some painting on paper, but with the Renaissance and new synthetic colors there was the start of a new art form. Albrecht Dürer (German, 1471–1528) and Hans Bol (Flemish, 1534–1593) were the first to show the possibilities of watercolor but it was still being used as a study medium in preparation of larger scale oils.
